The Cerebral Palsy National Cup took place on Saturday 23rd February at the David Ross Sports Village, University of Nottingham. 7 Teams entered the competition all playing for a place at the FA Disability Cup Finals at St Georges Park on Saturday 15th June 2019

Teams were split into 2 groups, the teams then played each other in their groups, with the top 2 teams from each group progressing to the Cup semi-finals. The teams finishing 3^{rd} and 4^{th} played each other for the Plate trophy.

Teams were competitive and there was a lot of good football on show throughout the day. Around 60 players took part in the football packed day.
